## Update from the Chair

The Ouseburn Learning Trust has been under constant review – pretty much since it came into being in 2014 – keeping up with changes and different strategic priorities. In the last year we have had changes in our administrative support and there will be further changes ahead as our current Trust Administrator, Gemma McNab, leaves to take up a career in teaching. Heaton Manor will leave just as soon as certain legal questions are resolved and will become Jesmond Park Academy, under the umbrella of the Gosforth Federated Academies Trust. Much of my time recently has been taken up with the transfer procedures associated with that. I am delighted that although Heaton Manor will no longer



be part of the Ouseburn Learning Trust, there are plans for the Head Teacher, Karen Blackburn, to continue to work closely with the Heads of all of the primaries.

There have been some changes to membership of the Board – Gordon Bell who represented Hotspur Primary, stood down and was replaced by Jon Bryan; Waz Baquir stepped in to represent Cragside in place of Emma Wardle. We welcomed Professor Greta Defeyter – nationally known for her work with Food Poverty and Holiday Hunger – representing Northumbria University, to replace David Littlefair, and Lorna Wright to replace Ed Milner, for Sage Gateshead. Lucy Backhurst who represented Newcastle University is in the process of stepping down and helping us to find a suitable replacement. The partnerships with these important external organisations are a vital part of our work and offer enrichment and opportunities for our children and students as well as helping our partners to understand the ever changing landscape for schools. I want to thank all of the past and current members of the Board for their energy, enthusiasm and commitment to the Ouseburn Learning Trust.

The interschool work goes from strength to strength with regular networking and training opportunities for staff at all levels – and we are creating a network for governors from each of the schools to work together from Autumn 2019. Children from all of the schools meet for various activities – music, drama, opera, sport and recently a meeting was held for all of the school councils. Children make new friendships with their counterparts from the other schools and this stands them in very good stead when they move on to secondary school.

All children receive a quality physical education curriculum in school, but it is the commitment to extra-curricular sport that continues to develop through inter-Trust competition. This is a springboard for selecting and entering teams in city competitions and success in these has meant that the OLT has been represented in regional finals in the Tyne and Wear Games events.

Diana Hales has again supported the Trust this year both in school curriculum PE and in organising the OLT events. She is a member of Heaton Manor's PE staff, but has spent time teaching at Benton Park, Cragside and Ravenswood across the year. She will continue in this role next year.
